

Why?

BBBSU serves children, ages 6-18, who are facing adversity. Kids who have Bigs for at least a year are more likely to avoid risky behaviors, do better in school, and have positive relationships with family and peers - changing the trajectories of their lives. As a mentor, you gain perspective and learn new things while giving back to your community. Our volunteers often say they "get more than they give."



We ask for a 12 month commitment. This ensures the best outcomes for the kids we serve.



Community-Based: Flexible schedule to meet 2-4 times monthly for approximately 6-12 hours per month.



Site-Based: Meet on a designated day weekly for 1 - 1.5 hours at one of our 20 sites state-wide (primarily meet Aug. - May only).



Mentor 2.0: Exchange emails weekly and meet in-person at a scheduled monthly 2 hour event (Sept. - May only).

We will call you to propose a "mentoring match" and you can decide whether to accept your "Little." Then you will meet your Little Brother/Little Sister at a "Match Meeting" with our staff at the Little's home or at the site-based program.

- Keep in touch with our agency & your mentoring specialist (return all phone calls promptly).
- You can come to BBBSU match activities. They are offered four times a year!
