What is Big Brothers Big Sisters?

Our Mission

To provide children facing adversity with strong and enduring, professionally supported one-to-one relationships that change a child's life for the better, forever.

One-to-one mentoring built on...

- Careful screening
- Thoughtful matching
- Thorough support of the mentoring match

Why are "Bigs" so important?

Of the 1,320 kids we served last year . . .

- 93% are living in low-to-moderate income households
- 48% are living with a single parent and 8% are living with neither parent
- 66% are members of a racial or ethnic minority group
- 13% have an incarcerated parent

A great mentoring relationship can be a positive factor that helps balance challenges some kids face, such as:

- Divorce
- Poverty
- Substance abuse
- Problems in school
- Problems relating to peers

What makes a great “Big”?

You do not need special skills, a ton of money, or to know that you are “good with kids” you just need to be:

- A caring, supportive person
- Willing to share time, ideas, new experiences
- Someone who embraces differences and loves to learn
- Able to set and hold boundaries
- Consistent

Almost all of the kids who need and want a Big Brother or a Big Sister have situations in their lives that reduce the likelihood that they will thrive as they grow up.

Your role as a mentor is to let them know they are important, that you care, and that despite their challenges you want to help them be their best selves.

A “Big” Commitment

We ask all “Bigs” to make a 12 month commitment to the child they are mentoring.

In mentor2.0 we hope you will stay together about 3.5 years

On average you will spend at least 4 to 6 hours per month mentoring your “Little.” (consider drive time and activity planning time)

In site-based programs it is an hour on a specified day of the week, weekly for the academic year and happens at a set location

In mentor2.0 weekly contact is electronic and in-person meetings are monthly on a set schedule during the academic year

3 Ways to make a “Big” Difference:

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Utah operates three different one-to-one mentoring programs:

Community-Based (Meet 2 – 4 times per month for whatever activities you choose together. Volunteer requirement: must be at least 18.)

Site-Based (Meet weekly at a site supervised by BBBSU staff – most are at schools in late afternoons. Volunteer requirement: must be at least 14 and a Freshman in High School).

Mentor 2.0 (Communicate electronically weekly and meet in-person monthly in evening. Focused on college access & success. Volunteer requirement: must have college degree.)

You Won't Be Alone ...

After you are matched with your "Little" a Mentoring Specialist on BBBSU staff will call you 13 times in the first year of the match (and less frequently after that) to help with things like:

- problem-solving
 - ideas for building a friendship
 - information about resources
 - support and feedback
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Next Steps

Complete the online questionnaire. It will take you 15 – 20 minutes to complete and submit. You may need to reference the previous information.

Fill out application. It will take you 1 – 2 minutes to complete and submit. You'll be given the link after you submit the questionnaire.

After you've submitted your questionnaire and application, we will email you a complete list of next steps to becoming a "Big." This includes setting up an interview, providing references, etc.

Your application will be processed and we will contact you to let you know if you are accepted.

Give us a few weeks as we spend some time reviewing "Little" applications, find kids on the waiting list who want a "Big", and find the one we think will most benefit from your mentorship.
